National Conference Update... The SAM Convention registration goes from \$220 to \$260 after March 7th (TODAY). Please be sure to register, this is one of the most important conferences in years. Our own Vinny Grosso will be installed as president.

Known as the only man to ever fool Houdini, Ottawa-born magician Dai Vernon is the subject of a new play opening in Ottawa. Written by Ottawa playwright Pierre Brault, The Shadow Cutter tells the story of Vernon, a gifted sleight-of-hand expert, and the secretive world of magicians in the 20th century. Dai Vernon — who was born in Centretown in the 1890's — is known as a legend among illusionists, said Brault.

Already known as The Professor for his encyclopedic knowledge of card tricks, Vernon earned another moniker in 1919 as The Man who Fooled Houdini when he performed a card trick the famous escapist was unable to unravel, despite seeing it performed seven times.

The Shadow Cutter runs from March 8th through March 27th at the Great Canadian Theatre Company's Irving Greenberg Theatre Centre at 1233 Wellington Street West.
